Transition to an Inter-Governmental Organization

- Convention was signed by the French Government (depository) on 27th January 2021
- Now **38 States** have ratified the IALA Convention
- On 22 August 2024 IALA transformed into an **Inter-Governmental Organization**

Education and Training

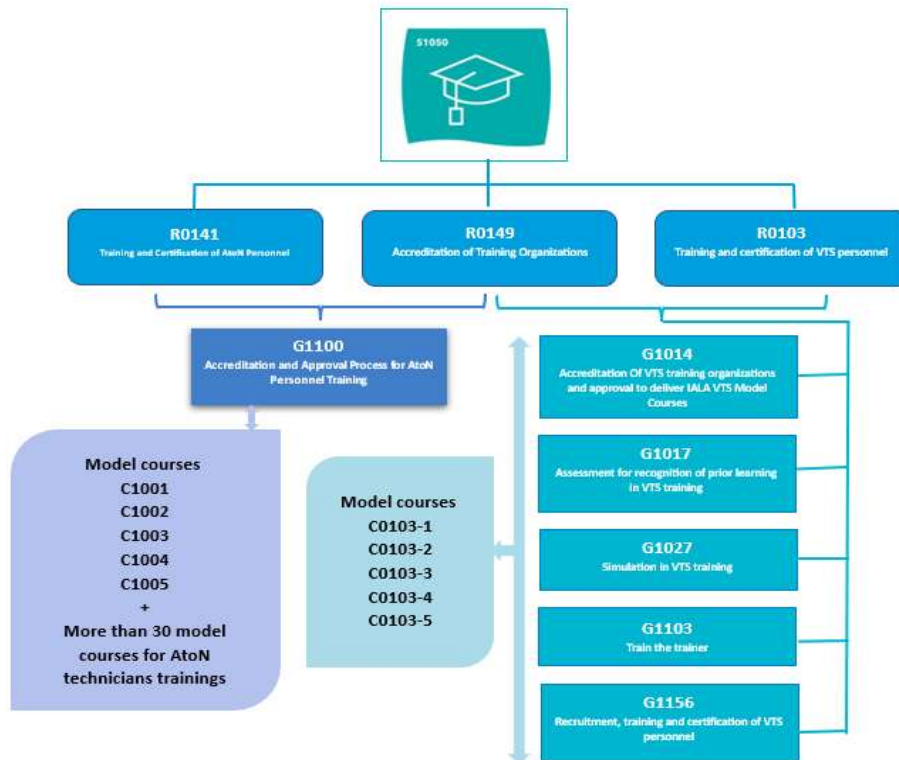


- Supports the development of IALA Model Courses in close cooperation with the IALA technical committees;
